Lisa Moten: How long have you been teaching at the Erma Byrd Center?

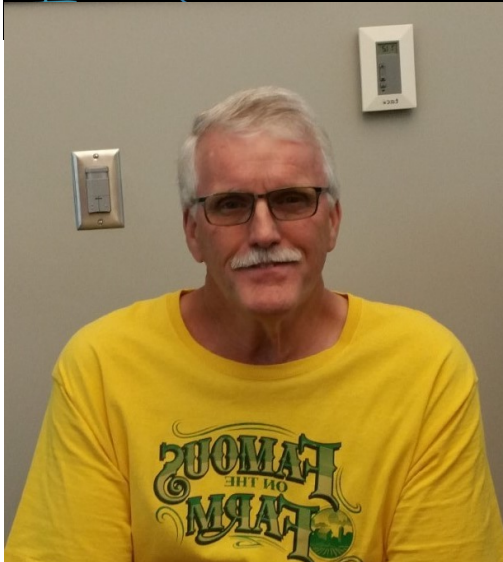
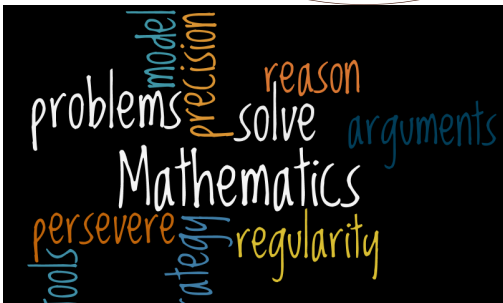
*Larry Griffith: Since it opened in the fall of 2007.*
